안녕하세요

An Nyung Haseyo

안녕

An Nyung



Welcome to Pyungsu ssi's
Korean class!!!

They both mean "Hello".
But "하세요" makes it polite.
So you have to use "안녕하세요" to elder people.
You can use "안녕" to your close friends.

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밥 먹으러 가요

Bob Mugro gayo

It means "Why don't we go to have meal"
You can use this sentence for breakfast, lunch, and also dinner time.
It is written "먹으러", but it sounds like "머그러, mugro"

"밥" originally (literally) means cooked rice. but we can use it for everyday meal.

"먹으러" is "to eat"

"가요" is "Let's go" or "Why don't we go"

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배 고파요

Bae Gopayo

It means "I'm hungry"

"배" is belly or stomach.

"고파요" means hungry, but it cannot be used alone. You have to use "고파요" following "배" all the time, like "배 고파요".

You can use this sentence with the sentence above, "밥 먹으러 가요", like follows.

배 고파요. 밥 먹으러 가요.

Bae Gopayo. Bob Mugro gayo

It means "I'm hungry, I want to eat something. Let's go to have meal."

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화장실에 가고 싶어요

Hwa Jang Sil Gago Sippoyo

I want to go to restroom.

It is written as "싶어요", but it sounds like "시퍼요" which can be written "sippoyo"

"화장실" is restroom.

"~에 가고 싶어요" means "want to go to~"

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뽀뽀 해주세요

ppo ppo hae ju se yo

It means "Kiss me please"

"뽀뽀" is "kiss"

"~해주세요" means "do ~ for me"

You can use this sentence to your boy friend. :~)

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너무 비싸요!

Numu bissayo!

It's too expensive!

"너무" is "very" or "too"

"비싸요" means "it's expensive"

So it means "it's too expensive" or "it's very expensive"
